HUMAN SEXUALITY

Background

Alberta Education has mandated the offering of the Theme V "Human Sexuality" components of the elementary, junior high and CALM 20 programs. The following procedures shall apply.

Procedures

- 1. At least two (2) weeks before the first class is offered, parents/guardians of all children who are to receive the instruction shall be sent information regarding:
 - 1.1 The content of the course,
 - 1.2 What is to be taught,
 - 1.3 The name of the teacher,
 - 1.4 The duration of the unit,
 - 1.5 The teaching and support materials to be used.
- 2. Parents/guardians shall be provided with the opportunity to preview all course resources and support materials in advance of instruction, where they request it of the Principal or teacher.
- 3. Parents/guardians shall have the opportunity to determine whether or not their children receive this information.
 - 3.1 Parents will be required to sign a Notice and Student Exemption Form (Form 205-1) indicating their wishes.
 - 3.2 This is to be returned to the Principal.
 - 3.3 Where a parental request is received, no instruction is to be given.
- 4. The Principal is charged with the responsibility of making appropriate supervised alternate arrangements for students who have opted out of the unit.
- 5. No student shall be penalized by means of a lower mark or grade as a result of opting out of the Human Sexuality unit.
- 6. The Division believes:
 - 6.1 That delivery of Theme V is best accomplished through the combined efforts of a teacher and medical/health unit personnel, or other trained professionals.
 - 6.2 That the basic tenet advocated in all discussions of human sexuality is that abstinence be advocated for all students, and that sexual activities be postponed until marriage.

- 7. In cooperation with appropriate agencies, the Division will provide in-service training for teachers preparing to instruct Theme V, on request.
- 8. No teacher who feels uncomfortable teaching a human sexuality unit shall be required to teach it.
