SAFETY ASSESSMENT

- 1. The safety assessment of an activity is to consider the following questions:
 - 1.1 Is the activity suitable to the age, mental and physical condition of the participant(s)?
 - 1.2 Have the participants been progressively taught and coached to perform the activity properly and to avoid the dangers inherent in the activity?
 - 1.3 Do daybook and lesson plans indicate this?
 - 1.4 Is the activity compliant with the standards that have been established for it, and where applicable is the equipment adequate and suitably arranged?
 - 1.5 Is the activity being supervised properly for the inherent risk involved?
 - 1.6 Is the activity consistent with Administrative Procedure 311 Student Safety
- 2. A negative determination with respect to any of these questions is to be considered by the teacher-in-charge and/or the approving authority (Principal or Superintendent or designate) as grounds to modify or forego the proposed activity.
