## HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION

## **Background**

All Division grade 12 students who wish to participate in a Division graduation ceremony must meet certain minimal requirements.

## **Definitions**

<u>Graduation Activities</u> shall mean all graduation related activities occurring before or after the graduation ceremony, including any events where alcohol is served or available for consumption.

<u>Graduation Ceremonies</u> shall mean the event where students are recognized for completing their high school education which may include a formal ceremony and dinner and dance provided no alcohol is served during any of these events.

## **Procedures**

- 1. To take part in the graduation ceremonies the student must be enrolled and have a satisfactory level of achievement in the courses necessary to satisfy the requirements for an Alberta Education High School Diploma or Certificate of Achievement.
- 2. Students must have a minimum of seventy-five (75) credits by February 1 of the student's graduating year and be registered by March in any other courses necessary for graduation.
- 3. Students may participate in only one (1) graduation ceremony in the Division.
- 4. The Principal has the authority to make decisions for the eligibility of students in extraordinary circumstances.
- 5. To provide graduation information to grade 12 students and then to parents, the Principal shall:
  - 5.1 Review this Administrative Procedure by November 1 with all grade 12 students.
  - 5.2 Send a copy of this Administrative Procedure to all parents of grade 12 students by March 1.
- 6. It is the responsibility of a graduation committee in consultation with the Principal and School Council, to plan and organize the graduation ceremonies.
  - 6.1 The local trustee will be invited to participate in the graduation ceremonies.

- 7. Neither the Board nor the school is responsible for any financial costs associated with graduation or for any financial liability that may arise as a result of the graduation ceremonies or graduation activities.
- 8. Executive staff, managers, certificated teachers and executive secretaries shall not participate in graduation activities involving alcohol whether planned or otherwise.
  - 8.1 In a community where both graduation ceremonies and graduation activities have been planned, the Principal shall ensure that all those attending the graduation ceremonies are advised when the graduation ceremonies end.
  - 8.2 Principals shall also, as much as is practical, take steps to distinguish and separate the graduation ceremonies from the graduation activities.
